

## Kettering racer to defend titles

Owned by Lenny Ryden and driven by Kettering's Gene Whipp, Heavy Hauler sprinted to both the 1971 national and world seven-liter hydroplane championships in last year's Dayton Championship Regatta at Eastwood Park Lake. Whipp, owner of Carlin Electronics Co., who classed hydroplane racing as a "hobby" after winning the world and national titles last year, will defend his
